

Survey into the cost of regulation

The LSB launched the survey to hear legal service providers' views on the cost of regulation.

The key aims of the survey were to:

- Gather views on the perceived cost of regulation split by different groups, market segments, and experiences of regulation
- Identify specific regulations and areas of regulation that cause the most concern for the regulated community, and identify where these are in the sphere of legal services regulation, or wider regulation
- Generate volunteers to participate in the more in-depth but smaller scale work to quantify the actual cost of regulation
- Provide areas of focus for the in-depth work to quantify the cost of regulation.

We designed the survey to allow for all the different ways legal professionals are regulated



The survey was heavily promoted to ensure as many responses as possible

Solicitors:

 SRA: sample of 3,000 contact details for entities and press release

Licensed Conveyancers:

- CLC: promoted survey through social media, its website and newsletter and at training events.
- LSB: emailed all of the entities regulated by CLC.

Trademark Attorneys:

ITMA: emailed its members.

Barristers:

- BC: press release
- BSB: Chair's Update
- LSB: collected sample email addresses of 1,507 barristers, 590 clerks and Heads of Chambers
- Middle Temple website link
- North Eastern Circuit emailed its members

Patent Attorneys:

 CIPA: emailed its members. Also used social media, its newsletter.

Chartered Legal Executives:

- IPS: emails to members
- CILEX: emails to members
- LSB: contacted ILEX regional groups via social media

Costs Lawyers:

- CLSB: emailed all cost lawyers
- LSB: emailed around ¾ of costs lawyers
- ACL: emailed its members

Notaries and Scriveners:

 Faculty Office: emailed all notaries

We checked the responses to ensure that the results were all valid

- Excluded duplicates
- Reweighted data
- Compared our survey responses to general population of authorised legal professionals
- Compared our data to other surveys
- Received external expert advice on methodology and analysis

The survey generated responses which are broadly representative on a number of measures of the profile of the regulated community.

However, the LSB recognises that there are a number of potential respondent biases as a result of how respondents were engaged and those self-selecting to respond to the survey.

Update – In-depth research

In-depth research led by external research company



The in-depth research will uncover the details of regulatory costs

- How much do regulatory processes/activities cost for individuals and entities?
- How much of this cost would individuals/entities incur even if there was no legal sector regulation...

Administrative costs total cost of complying with a set of regulations) Standard Cost Model Regulatory Overlap customer due diligence and reporting requirements Administrative burdens only costs that are incremental – avoiding commercial and regulatory overlap Commercial Overlap meeting clients' expectations and mitigating commercial risk

In depth research – what's happened so far

- January 2015: ICF tested research questions with authorised persons and external academics.
- **02 20 February 2015:** research live
 - Telephoned all participants to guide them through the questionnaire, to explain the intention of the questions and explain what information that we are requesting.
 - Circulated a 'frequently asked questions' document, providing any further useful information on answering the questionnaire, based on outcomes of phone conversations.
 - Telephone (or email) support for respondents at any point if they had questions about completing the survey.


Update – cost of regulators

 High level exploration of the spending of the LSB and of the approved regulators.




For the LSB = all functions funded by LSB levy

Update – cost of regulators – bench marking

- explore the spend of the approved regulators and the LSB on a number of functions
- compare their spend on these functions with appropriate benchmarks (for example from other regulated sectors and the wider economy) to establish if there are any outliers.
- Conducted by independent management accountants
