Title:	Post-Ministerial summit work streams: update and first output
Work stream(s):	Post-Ministerial summit work streams
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Status:	Official

Summary:

This paper updates the Board on the four cross-regulator work streams. It:

- 1. Sets out for each work stream progress to date and next steps;
- 2. Describes the plans for engaging the representative bodies in this work;
- 3. Includes for Board consideration at **Annex A** the first output from the work streams: proposals for minor/clausal changes to the existing legislative framework. These have already been agreed with regulator chairs (and are currently going through the regulators' internal governance processes) with a view to submitting jointly to incoming Ministers following the General Election:
- 4. Includes for information at **Annex B** the scoping paper for the work stream on legislative options beyond the Legal Services Act, which is being led by Professor Stephen Mayson; and
- 5. Includes at **Annex C** the recent letter from Minister Shailesh Vara to the Chairman, thanking the LSB for its engagement with the MoJ and for its work with the other legal services regulators on reducing regulatory burdens on practitioners


RECOMMENDATION

- 1. The Board is invited to:
 - <u>Discuss</u> progress and next steps on the post-summit work streams; and
 - Endorse the paper at **Annex A** setting out proposals for minor/clausal changes to the existing legislative framework.

BACKGROUND

2. In July 2014, Ministers called a summit of legal services regulators at which they laid down a challenge to the regulators to seek further deregulation in the sector. At the follow-up meeting of Chairs of the legal services regulators in October 2014, a series of cross-regulator work streams were agreed as set out in the table below. A further meeting of regulator chairs was held on 19 February 2015, at which progress on each work stream was reviewed.

3.	These work streams have been facilitated by the LSB but there has been substantial cross-regulator participation at executive level in each one.			
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7. The table below sets out for each work stream the planned output, the current status and the next steps.

Progress summary

Work stream and planned output	Current status and next steps
Planned output: a briefing document, with contributions from the frontline regulators, aimed primarily at Ministers post-election, but with possible wider audience as appropriate, which maps existing work by the regulators to reduce unnecessary regulatory burdens while maintaining appropriate consumer protection	
Identification of alternatives to avoid the handling of client money Planned output: a report that can be used as a resource by regulators and providers seeking to understand the alternatives that may be available (NB – not envisaged at this stage to be a Ministerial submission)	

Prioritisation of 5 – 10 "minor/clausal changes" which could be made to the legislative framework	
Planned output: a document for post- election submission to Ministers setting out proposals agreed across regulators	
Legislative options beyond the LSA Planned output: a document for post- election submission to Ministers setting out neutral options for alternatives to the existing legislative framework.	

Next steps

- 8. In the near term, the goal is to obtain sign-off from the regulators for the 'minor/clausal changes' paper at **Annex A** to become a cross-regulator joint submission to Ministers following the election.
- 9. There is a further meeting of regulator chairs scheduled for 8 April to consider the report on alternatives to handling client money and the two other planned Ministerial submissions:
 - The deregulatory status report; and
 - Legislative options beyond the Legal Services Act.
- 10. These documents will also come to the LSB Board, following their consideration by the regulator chairs meeting. A broader Board discussion also needs to take

- place informed by a prior discussion with MoJ officials regarding the timing and handling of the LSB's interactions with Ministers following the election.
- 11. Engagement with the representative bodies on the outputs from the post-summit work streams will ramp up over April.
- 12. Encouragingly, the regulator chairs have expressed interest in continued collaborative working following the election on an as-yet undetermined agenda. To that end, a meeting of regulator chairs has been scheduled for 30 June to identify candidate areas for further collaboration.
- 13. Our Chair wrote to the Minister with an update on this on24 February. The Minster's response of 9 March is attached at **Annex C.** It provides encouragement to our work on collaborating with other regulators especially on deregulatory initiatives.
