Summary:

Schedule 12 of Legal Services Act 2007 (**the Act**) sets out the circumstances in which a licensable body may apply to the Board for a decision that the body can apply to the Board (acting as a Licensing Authority (**LSB(LA)**)) for a licence. The Board (acting otherwise than as an LA or Approved Regulator) must makes rules about how it will review that decision. This paper sets out draft rules for consultation (**Annex A**).

(Note: If the Board decides that the body may make an application to it, then the application must be made in accordance with the LSB(LA)'s licensing rules. For the avoidance of doubt, a decision by the Board that a body may make an application to it for a licence is **not** a decision that the Board will grant that body a licence. A decision whether to grant a licence will be made by LSB(LA), after it has considered all the information provided in an application.)
