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#### Finance report for October 2014

#### Recommendation

The Board is invited to note and to comment on the Finance report.

#### Introduction

- 1. This paper provides a brief commentary about the period ending 31 October 2014. A financial report is attached (**Appendix 1**).
- 2. This report covers the first month of the year and spending is largely in line with expectations and forecasted variances.
- 3. Overall position –spending to the end of October is £1,997,451 against a budget of £2,068,739 resulting in an underspend of £71,288 (£29,784 in 2013).
- 4. *Cash position* following supplier, legal, HMRC and salary payments in October, the funds held in the bank have decreased from £4.92m to £4.46m.

#### Points to note

- 5. An analysis of the main spending headings reveals:
  - a) Board Costs The Board is still operating with one position vacant. The reduction in costs from this has been offset by a higher level of travel costs as a direct consequence of the fact that Board Members are drawn from areas which are not exclusively London-centric.
  - **b)** Staffing Costs During the month two colleagues took up their role at the LSB and two left. Recruitment for these roles is already underway.
  - c) Accommodation Costs We continue to make savings at our new premises at One Kemble Street. We are now occupying less space than when in Victoria House, but no longer have a dedicated large meeting room facility within our office space. When needed we hire rooms from our landlord, the Office of Rail Regulation and this provides better value for money.
  - d) Outsourced Services Our outsourced arrangements for IT continue to be effective. Preparations for the refreshing our IT infrastructure, having derived nearly 6 years of use from equipment with a normal useful life of three to four years, are progressing on schedule.
- e) Legal and Associated Costs The legal costs include the actual amounts paid to the end of October. Although the Court of Appeal found in our favour on costs as well as the substantive issue on the QASA judicial review on 30 October, the position is currently shown as 'over budget' as the exact position on whether there is a repayment and its timing will not be known until we know if the claimants will be granted leave to appeal to the Supreme Court and the outcome of the detailed cost assessment that would be necessary following the Appeal Court decision. If leave is granted, the uncertainty could persist well into 2015-16 or even further.
