Title:	SRA compensation fund s69 Order

Summary:

In 2011 the Lord Chancellor made an Order under s69 to amend the SRA's compensation fund powers to allow ABS firms to make contributions and pay out compensation grants from the existing statutory based compensation fund. That Order was time limited by a "sunset" clause that is due to expire on 31 December 2012.

The sunset clause was inserted as the SRA had indicated that it would undertake a review of the compensation arrangements in sufficient time to find a more permanent solution. However, that review was delayed and subsequently the sunset clause is due to expire without a suitable replacement being found. In order to ensure that compensation arrangements were in place a new s69 Order has been drafted. The Board gave publication authority for the public consultation of this Order at its April 2012 meeting.

The consultation closed on 13 July 2012 and three responses were received. These have been considered and a summary of consultation responses and decision document at **Annex A**. A draft recommendation is at **Annex B**. The SRA has consented to the Order being made.
