## **Summary:**

# Appointment to the Legal Services Consumer Panel – recommendation to the Board

### Background / context

- 1. This paper invites the Board to seek the approval of the Lord Chancellor as to the recommendation of appointment of a new member of the Legal Services Consumer Panel (the Panel), following interviews held on 23 January 2013.
- 2. In discussions with the Board Chairman in summer 2012, the Panel Chair reflected considerably on the current skill mix of the Panel and how it works together, and also reviewed the findings of a skills audit that the Panel completed earlier in 2011. The Panel Chair identified a number of skills gaps. In order to start to address the skills gap, and to provide additional capacity to deliver the work programme, the Panel Chair recommended the recruitment of one additional Panel member. On this basis, the Remuneration and Nomination Committee (RNC) agreed at its meeting on 25 June 2012 to recommend to the Board that an additional member be appointed.
- 3. Board Members will recall that the Board was updated about proposals in relation to the Panel appointment at its meeting on 11 July 2012 (Paper (12) 55b refers). The Board agreed with the Committee's recommendation that a new member be appointed, on the basis that: (i) the Panel have been running with a vacancy as Elisabeth Davies's role as Panel member was not back filled following her appointment as interim Chair (then Chair), (ii) that the Panel Chair considered that there are skills gaps to be filled, and (iii) the Accounting Officer confirmed that resources would be available to add this eighth role to the Panel.
- 4. The Legal Services Act 2007, at section 8, outlines the statutory framework for Consumer Panel member appointments. This makes clear that members are to be appointed by the Board, with the approval of the Lord Chancellor.

#### Report of Chair of the recruiting panel and recommendation to the Board

- 5. The report of the Chair of the recruiting panel, which sets out details of the role and person specification and process, as well as the panel's final recommendation, is attached at **Annex A**.
- 6. For background reference, current membership of the Legal Services Consumer Panel including background and location is attached at **Annex B**.

#### Recommendation

- 7. The panel recommends to the Board the appointment of **Frances Harrison** to the Consumer Panel, for onward submission to the Lord Chancellor for approval.
- 8. The proposed appointment is for a three year term (ending March 2016), staggered and aligned to the year-end appointments schedule for the Consumer Panel.
