Research Seminars – Summary

The research seminars proved to be a great success and brought forward a range of ideas from participants on areas that the research should aim to cover and thoughts on approaches (a full list of attendees is included on page 3 of this summary). I have not summarised all of the individual points made in the sessions but hope the table below summarises the majority of the key points and the broad direction of the discussion. In general there was a sense at the sessions that the types of research ideas suggested were good, but that we should be careful to draw on existing sources before commissioning new research. A copy of the final research plan for 2010 will be circulated once published on the LSB website in March 2010. We will endeavour to continue discussions over the year with all of those attending and will repeat these sessions early in 2011.
