

## Direction 66 issued under Part 3 of Schedule 4 to the Legal Services Act 2007 to the Solicitors Regulation Authority

- 1. This is a direction issued pursuant to paragraph 19(3) of Schedule 4 to the Legal Services Act 2007 (the Act).
- 2. Unless stated otherwise, words in this direction are used as they are defined in the Act.
- 3. In accordance with paragraph 19(3) of Schedule 4 to the Act, the Board has directed that the following alterations to regulatory arrangements be treated as exempt alterations for the purposes of paragraph 19(2)(c) of Schedule 4:
- a) The following alterations by the Solicitors Regulation Authority (SRA) to its training regulations:
  - Removal of requirement for student enrolment.
  - Removal of requirement for SRA to issue a certificate of completion of academic stage of training.
  - Replacement of exemption arrangements for qualification with power to recognise that specified outcomes have been met by equivalent means.
  - Removal of SRA requirements for course providers which duplicate QAA's requirements about recognition of prior learning and seeking certain exemptions.
  - Removal of requirement for training contracts to take place under terms specified by SRA.
  - Removal of reference to 'contentious and non-contentious' law from the training requirements and amendments to wording about experience in three distinct areas of law.
  - Removal of requirement for training principals to have four consecutive practising certificates and of the restriction on the number of trainees a firm may train.
  - Consolidation of two sets of regulations into one SRA Training Regulations 2014 will replace the SRA Training Regulations 2011Part 1 – Qualification Regulations and SRA Training Regulations 2011 Part 2 – Training Provider Regulations.
- b) Bringing into force of the trainee minimum salary proposals, agreed by LSB in December 2012, in the new training regulations.
- c) Consequential amendments to:
  - Qualified Lawyers Transfer Scheme (QLTS) Regulations 2011
  - SRA Admission Regulations 2011
  - SRA Suitability Test 2011
