

Direction 136 issued under Part 3 of Schedule 4 to the Legal Services Act 2007 to CILEx Regulation

- 1. This is a direction issued pursuant to paragraph 19(3) of Schedule 4 to the Legal Services Act 2007 (the Act).
- 2. Unless stated otherwise, words in this direction are used as they are defined in the Act.
- 3. In accordance with paragraph 19(3) of Schedule 4 to the Act, the Legal Services Board (the Board) has directed that the following alterations to regulatory arrangements be treated as exempt alterations for the purposes of paragraph 19(2)(c) of Schedule 4:

Amendments to the CILEx Exemptions Policy in order that successful completion of the Chartered Legal Executive Apprenticeship is a listed exemption to be admitted as Chartered Legal Executives

Proposed amendments

- 4. There are three amendments to sections of the exemptions policy that ensure successful completion of the Chartered Legal Executive Apprenticeship is a listed exemption:
 - Section 3 of the policy is amended to include the Chartered Legal Executive Apprenticeship as an exemption for Chartered Legal Executive status.
 - Section 5 of the policy is amended to include criteria and guidance required for meeting the Chartered Legal Executive exemption after completing the Chartered Legal Executive apprenticeship.
 - Appendix 1 confirms the Chartered Legal Executive Apprenticeship as a listed exemption.

Reason for exemption direction

- 5. The alterations do not represent a shift in CILEx Regulation's regulatory approach or policy. They simply confirm successful completion of the Chartered Legal Executive Apprenticeship as a valid exemption in order to be admitted as a Chartered Legal Executive.
- 6. A copy of the alteration was submitted to the Board on 1 April 2019.
- 7. This direction is to be deemed made on and to be effective from 16 April 2019.
