

I write with some hesitation to ask for your help. The Inn has recently come across certain difficulties with regard to the provision of members of the Inn representing students at Special Tribunals or before the Visitors. The Code of Conduct requires that a barrister be instructed by a solicitor or be licensed to conduct direct access work. Clearly the Inn who is bringing the case against the student will not pay for the student's access to a solicitor nor can the student possibly afford to instruct one himself. The BSB has instructed a member of the Complaints Committee to investigate this situation. In this case the hearing however is on Thursday 15 October at 5.30 pm and the student only asked for representation today although he had been given a barrister representative earlier. Unfortunately he dispensed with her as she was too pessimistic about his chances! He desperately needs representation as part of his case is that he is unable to succeed without cheating because of a learning difficulty! It may surprise you to know that he has a LLB and LLM yet an IQ below 70!

X

Very recently we have asked counsel to seek a walver from the requirement from the BSB. Fortunately in that case there was time to do so and a meeting of the appropriate committee to allow the decision making to proceed.

As you are an immigration judge you are, I imagine, no longer subordinate to the Code of Conduct. Nor, as far as I can establish, are you prohibited from assisting a student by presenting his plea of mitigation. As you know the Inn cannot go behind the finding of the provider. The student is accused of serious plagiarism. He is hoping to avoid being expelled. Should he be so expelled I have no doubt he will also appeal to the Visitor but by the time that happens I hope that we would have resolved the problem of barristers appearing *pro bono* for students both in domestic and Visitors hearings and that a junior member of the Bar will be able to assist the student.

You can imagine that this situation is causing considerable difficulties in all the Inns over the administration of their own hearings and before the Visitors. Sadly we have no idea who of our members has a direct access license which makes it all the more difficult.

The matter to which I am gravely concerned and outlining below regards my BVC results in BPP Law School, Holborn, London. I did pass eleven modules of my BVC last year; however, unfortunately I got failed twice in my Negotiation assessment. Following the Rules and Regulations of the BPP Law School, I waited for my final Negotiation re-sit due on 13th March 2008 as there was no opportunity to sit for the assessment in 2007. Although I put a great deal of efforts to hone my negotiation skills over this period of time, unfortunately I got medical problem in respect of my urinary bladder near the exams. Due to my medical problems and particularly shock of my brother's incident, my performance was severely and substantially impaired. In fairness, I struggled to concentrate during the whole assessment. Although I passed the exams with 50% marks, yet unfortunately, I failed in MPC (Must Pass Criteria). As a result of my third and final attempt in Negotiation assessment, pursuant to regulation 4.2 of the Assessment Regulations, I have failed the BVC overall subject to my application for concession or appeal. Although I have submitted my application for concession; however I have been told that the Examinations Board will sit probably on 16th June 2008 to consider, inter alia, concession applications. Hence, I was not allowed to take re-sit for Negotiation due on 23rd May 2008 rather I was told to wait for outcome of my concession application.

On the basis of independent evidences particularly medical certificates, I can say with reasonable certainty that the Examinations Board will accept my concession application. As a result I will be allowed to take final re-sit in 2009. However, this will affect me and my legal career on the following grounds:

- (a) Although I am not avoiding sitting for re-sit if the Examination Board accepts my concession application, I will have to stay in London for another year which will be a considerable financial burden which I cannot withstand at this time:
- (b) Neither I can go back to my home until or unless I qualify as barrister due to many personal as well as family reasons;

- (c) Even if I go back until assessment time, my father will not let me come back because I have told him that I have passed BVC due to many good reasons;
- (d) I will not be able to work as barrister for another year which may be milestone in my legal career; and
- (e) Last but not the least that it is increasing level of stress which I am unable to cope as I am already on medication in respect of my urinary bladder problem.

The reason I am putting my application to Education and Training Committee is that the Committee is "responsible for setting the standards of education and training that people must pass before being able to practice as barrister..." In addition, following Terms of Reference particularly term (b), the Committee is authorised to consider my application as I have exhausted remedies in respect of BPP Law School. Therefore, I request Education and Training Committee to consider my application in order to endorse me competent in my BVC results overall to be Called to the Bar on the following grounds:

- (a) I have overall passed the course except that I was failed by two marks in MPC which is due to above mentioned exceptional circumstances;
- (b) I was not given benefit of doubt given that I have passed the rest of the course;
- (c) I intend to practise in Pakistan, therefore; I absolutely do not reckon my negotiation and conference skills necessary or helpful on basis of style of legal practice there;
- (d) After passing all modules in BVC except MPC in Negotiation, the decision to fail me overall is extremely punitive and painful. Therefore, I request the Committee either to waive the rules and regulations in respect of BVC in my case on the basis of exception circumstances or to review these rules which are too stringent to provide academic relief to any student in my situation;
- (e) I have spent more than twenty thousand pounds on BVC so far which I still owe to my bank. Hence it is of great importance to qualify as barrister and pay off debt;
- (f) I have a lot of family expectations, particularly my diabetic and heart patient mother; therefore, I can not afford to shock her, which may cause her heart attack, with my failure in BVC;
- (g) I have not seen my family for the last two years, particularly my elder brother after he sustained injuries in the blast; therefore I want to see my family but unfortunately I cannot do this until I pass my BVC;
- (h) I have been in extremely stressful and painful condition since I failed in Negotiation last year. Due to various reasons, I can not tell my family and friends about re-sit which, as a result, is increasing my stress and worries;
- (i) I was not drifted to law career but I have had passion for law. I passed my law degree with flying colours and scholarship. I have done five mini-pupillages and a marshalling with a county court judge. Moreover, I have completed my LLM in which I am expecting high 2.1 grades;
- (j) Law career is my passion and qualifying as barrister is of great importance to me in terms of my future career. If I fail in BVC, it will ruin my whole career and life for which I suffered a great deal of financial and physical hardships since I left home in 1996;

(k) Having done my BA and MA in English Literature in I came to UK to qualify as barrister rather than doing PhD in English Literature against wishes of my father. Therefore, to qualify as barrister is to justify my decision to come to law which I had planned during my secondary education;

(1) I am willing to work for The Bar Council or for any good legal cause for any

reasonable period of time on pro bono basis;

(m)On merit and in consideration of all circumstances, I deserve to be awarded overall competent in BVC;

(n) I am willing to accept any condition the bar standard board deem reasonable and in accordance with educational standards of the Bar if I am Called to the Bar in July 2008;

(o) I reckon that it would not be a preferential treatment given above reasons;

(p) Although I am capable of practising in England and Wales on the basis of my qualifications, if I am Called to the Bar, yet I am willing even to sign a

declaration that I will not practise in England and Wales;

(q) If however, the Committee considers that I should improve my negotiation skills, I am willing to shadow or work with any legal practitioner or negotiator so as to hone my skills. Because even if my concession application is approved by the Examinations Board in BPP Law School, I will not be able to improve my skills on my own as I am not allowed to participate in Small Group Session with other students. Hence, the whole year will further rust not only my negotiation skills but also all other skills which I acquired during Bar Vocational Course. In sum, "practice makes a man perfect" and consistent practice makes a good and outstanding barrister;

(r) The so-called method of assessing the Negotiation skills is far from practical life which does not provide a real opportunity to reflect required skills of BVC

students: and

(s) On merit and in consideration of all circumstances, I deserve to be awarded overall competent in BVC.

In view of above grounds, I kindly request the Committee to award me competent overall to be Called to the Bar on 24th July 2008 (my Call date).

Should the Committee need any evidence with respect to above reasons, please let me know.


